PSHE Champion

Intent	At OWE, our intent is to build a PSHE curriculum that develops learning through respect and results in the acquisition of knowledge and skills which enables children to access the wider curriculum and to prepare children to be a global citizen now and in their future roles within a global community. In an every-changing world, it is important that they are aware, to an appropriate level, of different factors which will affect their world and that they learn how to deal with these, building their resilience so that they have good mental health and well-being. We want our children to have aspirations and value the achievements they and others make. Here at OWE, PSHE plays an important role, in promoting the spiritual, moral, social, and cultural development of our children.
Implement	The PSHE curriculum at OWE is designed to support the pastoral education for our pupils as well as the academic outcomes. Our curriculum covers the three PSHE core themes of Health and Well-being, Relationships and The Wider World. Teachers use our curriculum overview for each year group to plan and deliver weekly lessons as well as occasions where teachers feel it may be necessary to teach PSHE as a result of an issue arising in their own class or the school community. Children build on key knowledge, language and meanings in order to understand PSHE and use across the wider curriculum. All classes have a PSHE Floor Book to exemplify learning across the subject and show their responses and progress in lessons. These books travel with the children as they move into the next year group. Whole school assemblies make links to PSHE, British Values and SMSC. We teach and demonstrate our school values of aspiration, respect and resilience, and celebrate these when children display them. We have a wide variety of visitors and theme days/ weeks such as a Dogs Trust, Anti-Bullying Week and Mental Health week, which help to prepare children to be active and responsible citizens.
